General

1. General comments from the Center:

Registration

2. I am a new submitter, where should I go to find information on the entire submission process?

File Submission

3. We have historical data to submit back to January 2023. Can we submit these files by quarter?

After consulting with other APCDs and our own submitter community, the TX-APCD decided on a monthly data package. This is to ease the administrative burden on both the TX-APCD and the submitter as any failed month would cause a resubmission of the entire package. If the TX-APCD would allow resubmission of only the failed month, then the TX-APCD would have the difficulty of combining failed and successful packages. Hopefully, adjudicated claims by month are easy to produce, easy to validate, and does not bottleneck successful months from being loaded into the TX-APCD.

4. We are confused by the three-month delay in file submission.

The initial thinking was that the 90-day delay between the end of the reporting month and the start of the submission window would allow for claims to become fully adjudicated. However, this is simply the submission deadline. If you determine your claims are fully adjudicated before that date you may send them in earlier than the submission calendar dictates. Only fully adjudicated claims should be sent to the TX-APCD in the month in which they become fully adjudicated.

5. When is go-live for the CDL 3.0.1 and when will the test period be planned? Estimated timeframe?

At this time the Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) has not released any new formal rules for the TX-APCD (which would include the updated CDL). When they do, we intend to provide you with this updated CDL, testing and go-live timelines. While the changes appear to be minimal and mostly claritive, the TX-APCD will not spring this on the submitter community. When timelines become firmer, we will socialize them in a future submitter forum.

Miscellaneous

6. How often will these sessions be held or is this a one-time call?

The TX-APCD has changed the submitter forum to accommodate groups in different time zones. These meetings will be held on the 4th Tuesday of the month at 12:30 PM CT. Based on submitter feedback, we plan on going to a two-month cadence. Starting with our first submitter forum in January 2024, the meetings will occur every other month (March, May, July, September, November). Please ensure the TX-APCD has your latest contact information to ensure we can include you in the next meeting.

Security

7. We have a team that helps with the submission of the files and want to have access to the portal. Do each one of them have to have their own login?

Yes! The Texas Advanced Computing Center’s (TACC’s) security policy is that everyone accessing the system should create an individual account. The TX-APCD is designed so that multiple accounts can be associated with a registrant. TACC’s security policy also does not allow the sharing of accounts, which is a standard security best practice.
