# Highlights from 2024




The <u>2025 Texas Legislature Bill Tracker</u> is now live! This bill tracker has **7** categories, including healthcare, family and child health, school-based health, environmental health, nutrition/food access, physical activity, and tobacco/E-cigs, and **18** subtopics.



12 <u>Health Policy Resource Reports</u> were released on maternal and perinatal care, maternal mental health, food is medicine, opioid prevention, child developmental delays and disorders, early childhood intervention, child poverty, congenital syphilis, non-medical drivers of health, period poverty, and more.



4 TX RPC Project <u>Lunch & Learn</u> presentations were held at the State Capitol and included topics on congenital syphilis in Texas; childhood obesity prevalence in Texas after COVID-19: findings from the 2021-2023 Texas School Physical Activity and Nutrition Survey; non-medical drivers of health; and food is medicine.



The Michael & Susan Dell Center for Healthy Living hosted 25 <u>webinars</u> on maternal and child health, mental health, nutrition, physical activity, non-medical drivers of health, and more.



**14** TX RPC Project <u>newsletters</u> were developed highlighting health policy resource reports, TX RPC Project researcher publications and projects, webinars, and events.



1 TX RPC Project manuscript was published, Bridging Public Health Research and State-Level Policy: The Texas Research-to-Policy Collaboration Project, and we have 2 manuscripts under review and 2 manuscripts in progress.
