


Texas' growing and diverse population, geography, and array of cultures are only a few of the benefits that make the Lone Star State an ideal place to conduct public health research.

In 2024, Texas had over 31.2 million people;



**7.5 million** of them are under the age of 18.

More than a **quarter** of all children in the U.S. are Hispanic or Latino.

Texas has the **second-largest population** of children under 18, representing **10%** of all children in the U.S.

Every **80 seconds** a child is born somewhere in Texas.
