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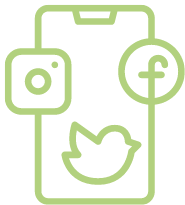
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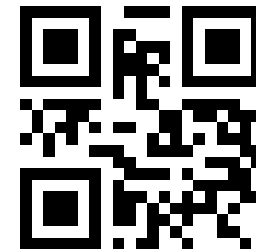

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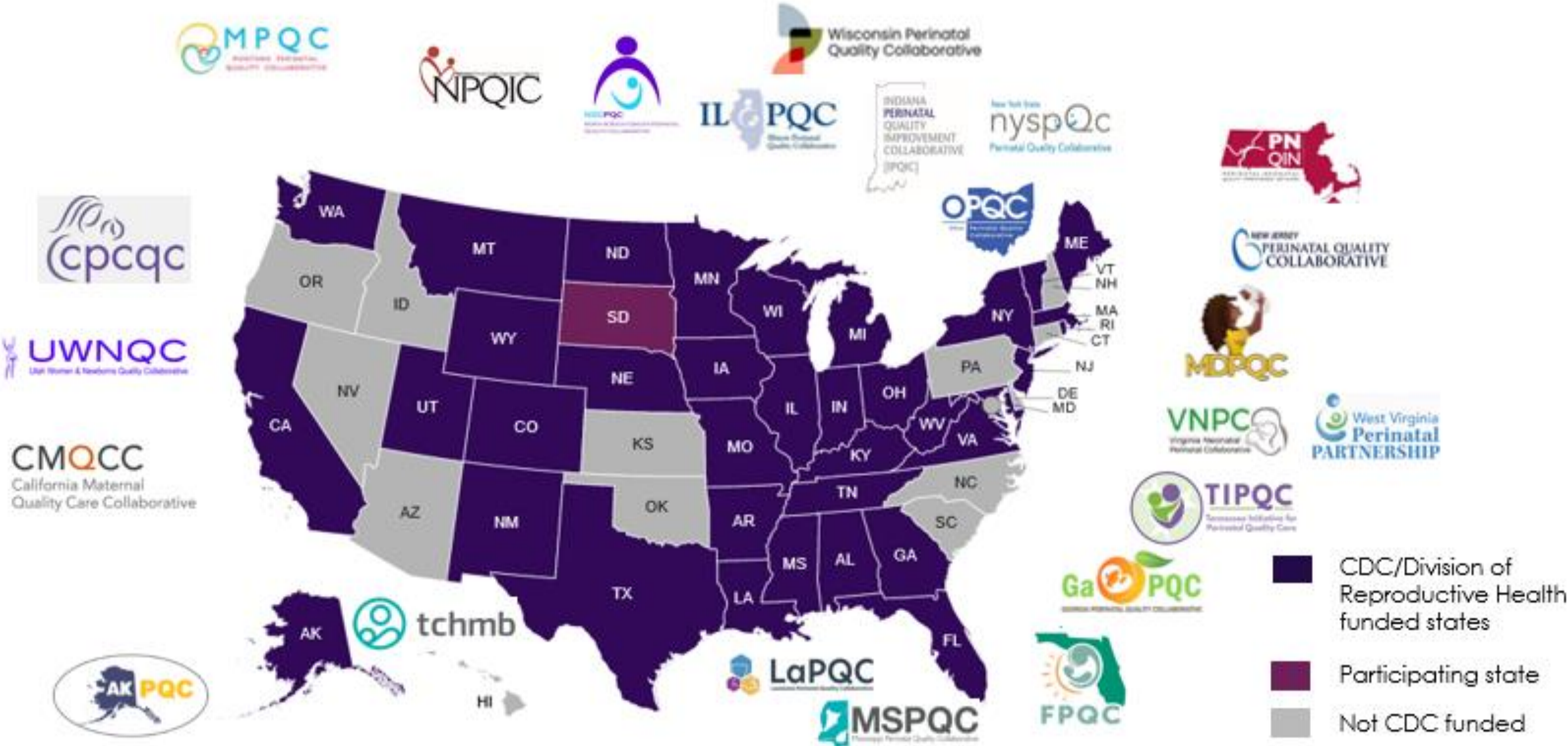

Perinatal Quality Collaboratives (PQCs)

- Who?
 - State or multistate networks of teams
 - Partnerships with hospitals, providers, nurses, patients, families, and other stakeholders — including the National Network of Perinatal Quality Collaboratives (NNPQC)
- What?
 - Identify health care processes that need to be improved
 - Spread best practices
 - Reduce care variation
 - Optimize resources
- Where?
 - All 50 states and Washington, D.C.
- Why?
 - Improve the quality of care for mothers and babies
- How?
 - Using data-driven, continuous Quality Improvement (QI)

TCHMB MISSION & GOALS



Mission: To advance **health care quality, equity and patient safety for all Texas mothers and babies** through the collaboration of health and community stakeholders as informed by the voices of the patients we serve

Goals:

- Reduce preterm birth.
- Reduce maternal/infant morbidity and mortality.
- Eliminate health disparities and inequities.
- Improve health outcomes using the life course approach.
- Strengthen involvement of partners/families.
- Improve the health environment for mothers and babies.

STRATEGIES



1. Implement **high-valued quality improvement projects** that address health priorities, promote equity, and eliminate disparities.
2. Establish a **robust data system** to drive quality improvement.
3. Establish **governance** that supports stakeholder engagement and good stewardship of resources.
4. Disseminate **effective educational content**.
5. Enhance **collaboration with key partners** to drive quality improvement.
6. Involve **people with lived experience** at the governance level.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF TCHMB

The Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) Healthy Texas Babies (HTB) Expert Panel transitioned to become TCHMB. Coordinated and facilitated by DSHS, TCHMB grew to approximately 150 members.

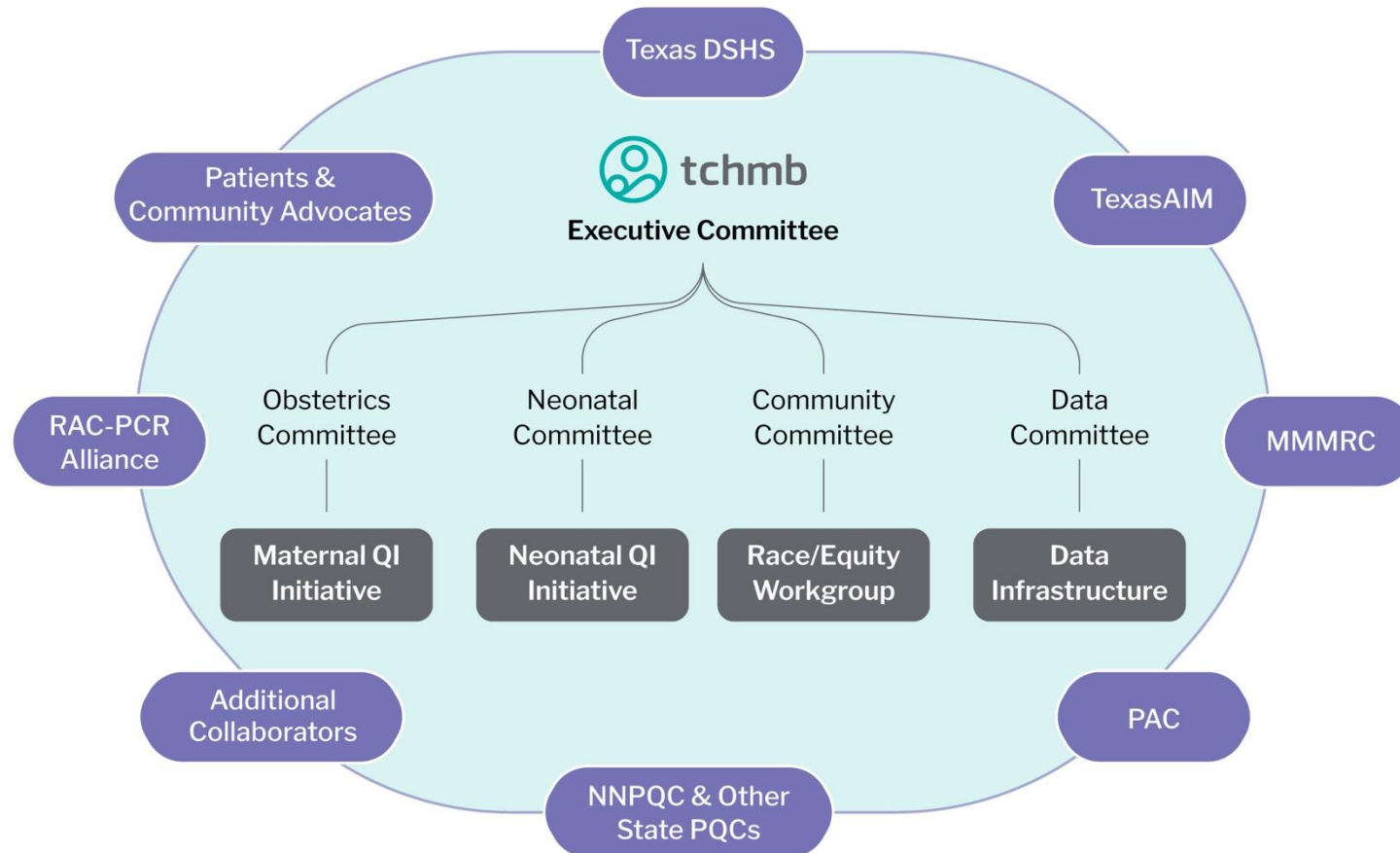
