

Describe the danger of using fentanyl. Identify the substances that fentanyl can be found in. Describe the signs of overdose and how to respond if someone is overdosing. Explain how to get help for addiction. Describe the top three facts students need to know about fentanyl. Demonstrate refusal skills and other strategies for avoiding fentanyl use.

Lessons 5 & 6: Expand beyond the lens of the youth vaping epidemic to provide a foundational understanding of all kinds of substance misuse. Lessons 7 & 8: Revisit the timely topic of vaping with two supplemental lessons designed to reinforce key ideas through additional learning modalities. The Fentanyl Facts lesson (supplement for grades 6-12): Allows students to investigate the dangers of fentanyl and gain crucial skills to identify fentanyl, avoid fentanyl and respond to a fentanyl overdose.
