## Protecting the Health and Safety of our Community



**We are providing health and safety training to residents, volunteers and workers helping with flood cleanup and need your help!**

Flooding in Houston due to Hurricane Harvey has left many in our community with questions on how to safely cleanup and remove flooded materials from homes, schools and businesses. We will offer training on best practices for clean-up and on the proper use of masks and gloves, which we will provide. **Bilingual Spanish speakers needed.**

1. **Join us in Trainings**, to be held on the following Wednesdays and Fridays over the next two weeks, September 13, 15, 20, 22 from 1:00pm - 4:30pm at UTHealth School of Public Health, RAS Building, 10<sup>th</sup> floor West, Room 1012. Come as your schedule allows. Training will take up to 30 minutes.
2. **Help assemble training packets** during the training sessions.
3. **Make a difference and train our neighbors, starting Thursday, Sept. 14, 2017.** You will go out into neighborhoods during daylight hours in groups of 3 with all materials needed. Schedule is flexible.
4. **Provide your CITI Human Subjects Education Certification**, if you have it. Remember that certification is valid for 3 years. If you do not have, take the training now: <https://www.uth.edu/cphs/for-researchers/training.htm>.
