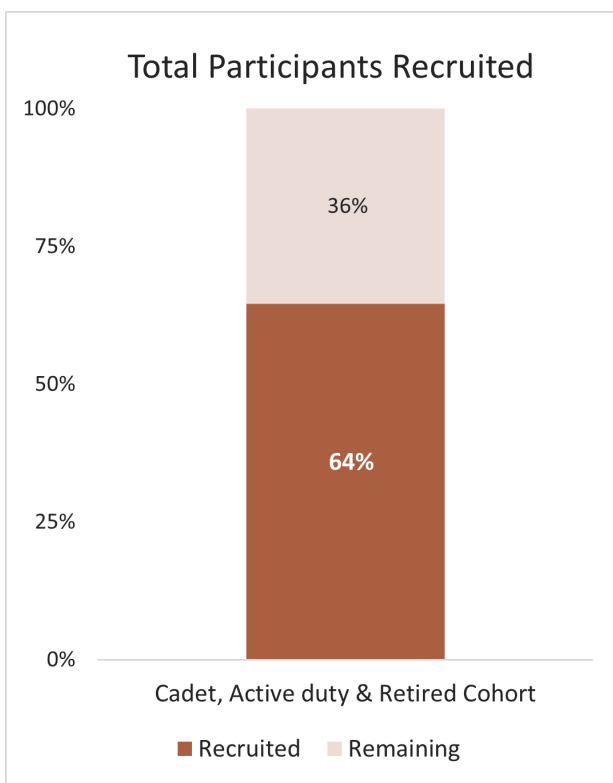


## Texas Firefighter Cancer Study

#### Recruitment Progress Update



In February and early March, the Texas Firefighter Cancer Study (TFCS) research team conducted another successful round of baseline sampling with retirees at the Houston Professional Fire Fighters Association (HPFFA), IAFF Local 341. A total of **52** retirees participated on February 21, surpassing our previous sampling campaign.

On February 26, we also completed baseline sampling with a cadet class at the Val Jahnke Training Facility, bringing this cohort to **106** total participants, exceeding our goal by 6%.

We extend our sincere appreciation to all our participants. Your continued commitment and engagement make this study possible. We are also grateful to the Houston Fire Department, Val Jahnke Training

Facility, and HPFFA for their on-site support and help recruiting participants. Your time, assistance, and generosity play a vital role in advancing this important effort.

### Texas Firefighter Occupational Cancer Epidemiology

The Texas Firefighter Occupational Cancer Epidemiology study focuses on cancer incidence among firefighters statewide. By linking firefighter-specific databases with the Texas Cancer Registry (TCR), we will characterize cancer rates, identify high-risk occupational exposures, and generate evidence to inform protective measures for firefighters.

We have partnered with the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) to evaluate cancer incidence among firefighters and are currently awaiting approval from their institutional review board (IRB), which will formally launch our analysis.

### Texas Firefighter Cancer Screening Promotion

We are pleased to share that the UTHealth Houston IRB has approved the Texas Firefighter Cancer Screening Promotion project within our larger study.

We are currently recruiting **active-duty firefighters in Houston** to participate in a focus group discussion to better understand cancer screening practices and barriers to care

within the Houston Fire Department. These sessions will be conducted either in person at your respective fire station or virtually via Microsoft Teams.
