Recruitment efforts at fire departments across the state, as well as among retired firefighters, are now underway. Recently, the Texas Firefighter Cancer Study (TFCS) team met with a group of retired firefighters at Champ Burger, of Houston's oldest burger establishments. Over a shared meal, we presented details about the study. addressed questions, and provided an overview of the next steps. response was overwhelmingly positive —approximately half of attendees expressed interest in participating in the study.

NEXT STEPS

We're preparing for our first Stakeholder Advisory Board meeting, which will bring together representatives from fire departments, firefighter unions, and firefighter associations. The goal of this meeting is to ensure that their perspectives, experiences, and expertise help guide the project so that the study reflects what matters most to the firefighting community.

The research team will also be conducting a full-scale simulation exercise at the fire academy to review sampling logistics, test equipment, and refine team coordination. This exercise will serve as the final readiness check to validate all operational study protocols before upcoming emergency response activities.

Additionally, Principal Investigator Dr. Jooyeon Hwang will be traveling to Austin, TX to present an overview of the Texas Firefighter Cancer Study at the upcoming Texas Commission on Fire Protection meeting.
