This two-year program includes completion of the requirements for a Master of Public Health degree, and twelve months of full-time experiential rotations in various aspects of professional practice in the field and are prepared to participate in a multi-disciplinary approach to planning, implementing, managing, and evaluating programs and services for worker health and safety. Graduates are eligible to apply for board certification in Occupational Medicine by the American Board of Preventive Medicine.
