Total Worker Health® focuses on policies, programs and practices integrating protection from work-related safety and health hazards with promotion of injury and illness prevention efforts to advance worker well-being.

After completing the traineeship, students will be able to conduct research that characterizes worker well-being, as well as implement policies and practices that improve workers' health.

Benefits of traineeship:
